A PLACE TO CALL HOME: KEATON'S HOUSE UPDATE



At Keaton's House — Paul Paletta Children's Hospice, children and their families will have the opportunity to stay for multiple days or weeks for end-of-life care, but they can also drop in for medical clinics, day programming, family respite and even bereavement support.

Through our partnership with McMaster Children's Hospital, an estimated 1,000 children throughout South Central Ontario will have access to this hospice and its services. Located just a 10-minute drive from McMaster Children's Hospital, the hospice will mean children and their families have more immediate access to doctors staffed onsite for medication adjustments, appointments and everyday care in a supported, home-like setting.

The life and work of Dr. Bob Kemp drives everything we do. He believed that no one should face the end of their life without the necessary care and support. It is why we are pushing to fill this care gap in our community for infants, youth and their families.


